The artist says of this exhibition...

Emotions can shift in an instant, or they can gradually transform. Both the subtle curves and acute angles within my art point to the wide-ranged spectrum and frequency of emotions. One can be cruising in a state of contentment and suddenly take a sharp turn into another state– whether joy, affection, sadness, anger, fear. On the other hand, emotions can transition subtly, over time, and with more fluidity. I use this fluctuation to inform the blueprint of my art.

**LORI COZEN-GELLER** grew up in Los Angeles, California and received her Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Southern California. She currently lives and works in Venice, California. Lori's first work took shape within hours of her father's passing. During this transformative period, the artist translated her feelings of love and loss onto a scrap of paper, the blueprint for her first piece of work.

During the art process, Cozen-Geller looks to capture the emotions of the heart and mind and places them into visual form within space
